RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. NAME

The Association Shall be called the Middlesex County Table Tennis Association.

2. OBJECTS

2.1. The Association shall be affiliated to the English Table Tennis Association (ETTA)

2.2. The objects of the Association shall be as follows:

2.2.1. To act as the controlling body for the game of Table Tennis in the County of Middlesex subject to any overriding decisions of the National Council of the ETTA.

2.2.2. To assist and encourage the formation of Table Tennis Leagues and Clubs in the County of Middlesex and to promote the game in every possible way.

3. AREA OF JURISDICTION

The area of jurisdiction of the Association shall be the County of Middlesex as defined by the Rules of the ETTA.

4. DEFINITIONS

4.1. In these Rules and any regulations made hereunder the following words and phrases shall have the meaning assigned by this Rule.

4.1.1. The Association: the Middlesex County Table Tennis Association.

4.1.2. Casual vacancy: A vacancy which occurs at a time when the normal procedure prescribed by the Rules for filling it cannot operate.

4.1.3. ETTA: English Table Tennis Association

4.1.4. Member: Any person mentioned in Rule 5.1 or any official, player or other individual member of a body mentioned in Rule 5.1.2 or of a club in membership of or affiliated to such a body

4.1.5. National Council: the National Council of the ETTA.

4.1.6. Youth League: a Local League comprised wholly of Youth divisions consisting entirely or of Youth Clubs and School Clubs

4.2. Words and phrases defined by the Rules of the ETTA and not otherwise defined by these Rules shall have the meaning assigned to them by the Rules of the ETTA.

5. CONSTITUTION

5.1. The Association shall consist of

5.1.1. President, Vice-Presidents, Honorary Life Members, duly elected officers and duly appointed officials.

5.1.2. All Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals affiliated to the E.T.T.A which are within the jurisdiction of the Association as prescribed by the National Council (except those exempted by decision of the National Council).

5.2. The Association shall without payment of fee accept into Good Standing the following, but no other, bodies:

5.2.1. All organizations within the jurisdiction of the Association which are in Good Standing with the ETTA.

5.2.2. All County or Regional Associations or organizations covering the area or part of the area of jurisdiction of this Association which are part affiliated to the national Associations or organizations in Good Standing with the ETTA.

5.2.3. The County Schools Table Tennis Association(s) and Schools leagues and School Clubs within the jurisdiction of the Association except such as are affiliated.

6. AFFILIATION

6.1. Affiliation to the Association shall be compulsory for all Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals in the County, unless exempted by a decision of the National Council.

6.2. Application

6.2.1. Applications for affiliation shall be made on the current affiliation form by a responsible officer of the applicant body who shall sign the form on behalf of that body.

6.2.2. Applicants for direct individual affiliation shall complete and sign the current affiliation form.

6.3. A Club or Individual not directly affiliated to the ETTA may apply to be directly affiliated to the Association provided that it or he/she is affiliated to the ETTA through another body.

6.4. Every Local League and Directly Affiliated Club shall send to the General Secretary of the Association not later than the 31st July preceding each season, a copy of its current affiliation rules.

6.5. No person or body may affiliate to the Association unless affiliated to the ETTA.

7. AFFILIATION FEES

7.1. Affiliation fees per season shall be as follows:

7.1.1. Local Leagues: £4.50 per team place plus £4.50 for one reserve place.

7.1.2. Youth Leagues: 20% of the current affiliation fees for Local Leagues.

7.1.3. Directly Affiliated Clubs: Seven times the team place fee quoted in Rule 7.1.1 above, whether a member of a local league or not.

7.1.4. Directly Affiliated Individuals: Twice the team place fee quoted in Rule 7.1.1

7.2. Date for payment: Affiliation fees shall be paid on or before 15th November each season to the Treasurer or the Association.

7.3. If the total Affiliation fees payable calculated at any date between 15th November and 30th April in a season exceed that already paid, the difference shall be paid to the Hon. Treasurer by 15th May.

8. OFFICERS, NATIONAL COUNCILLOR AND OFFICIALS

8.1. The Officers of the Association shall be: Chairman, Deputy Chairman, General Secretary and Treasurer.

8.1.1. The officials of the Association shall be: Umpires Secretary, County match Secretaries, Inter League Championships Secretary, Tournaments Secretary, Press & Website Secretary, Development Secretary and Coaching Secretary and any other person who in the opinion of the Management Committee will be able to assist the Association in its management functions. Casual Vacancy: may be filled by the Management Committee

8.2. National Councilor

8.3. Between May 1st and June 15th each administrative year the

8.3.1. Management Committee shall elect the National Councilor and Deputy to represent the County for the following administrative year, after considering all nominations submitted to them by Members of the Association

8.3.2. The General Secretary shall send a copy of the Management Committee Minute recording the election or the information required by the ETTA official appointment form certified by himself and by a second person who must be the Chairman, Deputy chairman or Treasurer to reach the ETTA General Secretary or such other person as may be designated for the purpose by the ETTA Management Committee by June 20th.

9. MANAGEMENT

9.1. The affairs of the Association shall be managed, subject to the control of the Annual General Meeting, by a Management committee consisting of (1) the Officers (2) the persons representing the Association on the National Council (3) the officials (4) a representative from each League nominated at the Annual General Meeting

9.2. Co-Option: The Committee shall have the power to co-op not more than two other members of the Association. Co-opted members shall have the right to vote.

9.3. Casual Vacancies: The Committee shall have the power to fill a Casual Vacancy in any office or on the Committee until the next Annual general meeting and to invite at its sole discretion, any persons to attend any of its meetings> persons so attending shall not be entitled to vote at Committee meetings.

9.4. Meetings: The committee shall meet not less than six times a year.

9.5. At least 28 days notice in writing of the place, date and time of every meeting shall be sent to every member of the Committee.

9.6. Quorum: The business of the Committee may be transacted by not less than three members.

9.7. Chair: In the absence of both Chairman and Deputy Chairman the Committee shall elect one of its numbers to take the chair for the meeting.

9.8. Voting: Every question at a meeting of the Committee shall be determined by a majority of the members present and voting, every member having one vote. In the case of an equality of votes the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.

9.9. Regulations: The Committee shall have the power to make Regulations to cover such matters not specifically dealt with in these Rules as it thinks fit.

9.10. Standing Sub-Committees: At its first meeting following the Annual general meeting the Committee shall appoint Standing Sub-Committees to deal with the following matters: (1) Umpiring (meetings of this Sub-Committee shall be owned by the Umpires Secretary) (2) Discipline

9.11. Sub-Committees: The Committee may delegate any of its duties and powers to Sub-Committees consisting of such person as it shall decide, provided that at least one member shall be a member of the Committee. Any Sub-Committee shall, in the performance of its duties, conform to the Terms of reference laid down by the Committee. Unless decided otherwise by the Committee, the chairman of a Sub-Committee shall be responsible for reporting to the Committee.

10. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

10.1. Date: Each season the Association shall hold an Annual General Meeting during July

- 10.2.** Notice: To call the AGM, the General Secretary shall give at least 28 days notice in writing of the place, date and hour together with the Agenda, and the forms of nomination for election of officers and officials, to the President, Vice Presidents and Officers and to the General Secretary of each local League and Directly Affiliated Club and to each Directly Affiliated Individual.
- 10.3.** Accredited Representative: Each Local League and Directly Affiliated Club shall appoint one Accredited Representative to each General Meeting. Only the Accredited Representative shall be entitled to cast his League's or Club's votes(s).
- 10.4.** Right to attend: Attendance at the meeting shall be open to all Members.
- 10.5.** Agenda
- 10.5.1.** The following items shall be included: (1) Minutes of the previous AGM (2) Minutes of any Special General Meeting held since the previous AGM (3) Annual Report of Management Committee (4) Statement of Accounts (5) Rule Change Propositions (if any) (6) motions of which the General Secretary has received notice in writing not later than the preceding 15th may (7) election of President, Vice-Presidents etc. (8) Election of Officers and Officials (9) Election of Management committee Members (10) Appointment of Auditors. The following special provisions are applicable to items (8) and (9): Each Local League or directly Affiliated Club shall be entitled to nominate as many persons as there are vacancies in respect of officers, officials and Committee members to be filled, and no more. No nomination will be effective unless received by the General Secretary within 14 days of the issue of the nomination paper.
- 10.5.2.** Motions not included in the Agenda shall not be voted upon except with permission of the Chairman.
- 10.6.** Voting
- 10.6.1.** General Provisions: Each directly affiliated club shall be entitled to one vote, each local league to a number of votes equal to one half of the number of teams affiliated, to the nearest higher whole number. No directly affiliated individual is entitled to vote"
- 10.6.2.** Postal Voting: The voting for the officers and the officials shall be by postal vote, if there are more valid nominations than there are vacancies to be filled which shall be conducted in such a manner as may be determined by the Committee from time to time. Scrutineers shall be determined by the Committee to determine any questions as to the validity of nomination papers, and ascertain the result of any postal vote held under the provisions of the Rule.
- 10.7.** Special Majority: No resolution altering the Rules of the Association or the Regulations for the Inter-League Championships shall be declared carried unless at least two thirds of the total votes cast are in favour of that resolution.
- 10.8.** Fine for non-attendance: Any Local league not represented at the AGM by an Accredited representative shall be fined the sum of £25
- 10.9.** Proxies: Proxies will be recognized only if they have been given in writing and record a specific decision on a specified proposition

11. SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

- 11.1.** A Special general Meeting shall be convened on a resolution of the management Committee or to take place within 35 days after receipt by the General Secretary of a

requisition signed by the authorized representatives of at least half the Local Leagues stating the business to be transacted at the meeting.

11.2. Rule 10 (except sub-rules 10.1 and 10.5) shall apply.

11.3. A Special General Meeting Shall transact only such business as is specified in the resolution or requisition convening it.

12. FINANCE

12.1. Bank Account: The funds of the Association shall be kept at a Bank or invested in a Building Society or other security approved by the Association.

12.2. Cheque Signatories: All cheques etc. drawn on the Ban, Building Society and other accounts shall be signed by any two of the following: Chairman, Deputy Chairman, General Secretary and Treasurer

12.3. The Financial Year of the Association shall end on 31st may

12.4. Auditors: The accounts of the Association shall be audited each season by auditors appointed by the AGM

12.5. All income and property of the Association from whatever source derived, shall be applied solely to the promotion of the objects of the ASSOCIATION.

13. DISSOLUTION

In the event of the winding up or dissolution of the Association, any surplus assets remaining after discharge of liabilities shall automatically vest in the ETTA who shall hold them for a period of six years in trust to pay them to any organisation set up with objects identical with or similar to those of the Association (the ETTA during such period making every endeavour to promote and encourage the formation of such an organization) and thereafter for the general purposes of the ETTA.

14. APPEALS FROM LEAGUES

14.1. Any Member or affiliated club aggrieved by a decision or action of a Local League, or a Committee, Officer or official of such League, or by neglect or refusal to do something which such organisation or person is under a duty to do, may appeal against such decision, action neglect or refusal to this Association whose proper decision shall be final and binding on all parties.

14.2. The Association shall not have power to reverse a decision or action which is in accordance with the Rules or Regulations of this Association or of the ETTA or of the principles of natural justice.

14.3. Any such appeal shall be made in writing to the General Secretary within 21 days after notification of the decision or action or neglect or prescribed by the ETTA and specified in the Schedule to this rule. The fee shall be returned if the adjudicating body considers the making of an appeal to have been justified (whatever the result). The adjudicating body shall be formed from a Board of Appeal, which shall be appointed by the Management Committee at the first meet-ing of the season. Each appeal shall be determined by three members of this Board selected by the Officers.

14.4. Either party to the Appeal shall be entitled to require a Hearing before the adjudicating body.

14.5. Any party may be represented at a Hearing provided that the Association is notified in advance in writing of the intention to be represented.

14.6. The decision of the Board, which shall be final and binding on all parties, shall be published forthwith and a written minute of the decision shall be sent to all parties to the appeal.

14.7. Whilst any appeal is pending the decision action neglect or refusal against which the appeal has been made shall not have effect. An appeal shall be deemed to be pending from the time notice of appeal is received by the General Secretary.

15. DISCIPLINARY

15.1. A Member shall not do or cause to be done anything deliberately harmful to the Association nor likely to bring the Association or the game of Table Tennis into disrepute.

15.2. A Member shall not without good and sufficient cause

15.2.1. absent himself from the Hearing of any allegation or appeal after having been requested with reasonable notice to attend

15.2.2. refuse or neglect to answer any question put to him in connection with such allegation or appeal of directed to answer by the chairman of the adjudicating body

16. SUSPENSION

16.1. For a breach of this Association's Rules or Regulations the Association shall have power to suspend any Local league, club, player or official within its jurisdiction, under the power created by ETTA Rules and subject to the right of appeal provided by such Rules

16.2. The ETTA General Secretary shall be notified of any suspension under this Rule.

16.3. Such suspension shall be enforced by all bodies in this county, but shall operate only within the jurisdiction of the Association, the suspended person or body being deprived of the privileges of membership of or affiliation to the Association and any Local League or Directly Affiliated Club affiliated to the Association, but not of the privileges of membership of or affiliation to the ETTA enjoyed outside the jurisdiction of the Association

17. DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE

17.1. The Standing Sub-Committee referred to in Rule 9.10 (2) shall be called the Disciplinary Committee and shall consist of five persons, any of whom may be an officer or an official (but subject to Rule 9.11) and one of whom shall be designated as Chairman by the Management Committee.

17.2. Members of the Disciplinary Committee shall (unless they resign) serve until the end of the season in which they are appointed and thereafter until the appointment of their successors. Casual Vacancies shall be filled by the Management Committee.

17.3. A decision may be taken by not less than three members, all of whom must have been present throughout the hearing.

17.4. Any member of the Disciplinary Committee having an interest in a matter to be discussed must declare that interest as soon as he is aware of it, and must not be

present in his capacity as a member of the Disciplinary Committee during the transaction of the business.

- 17.5. Should disqualification under Rule 17.4 leave less than three members as required by Rule 17.3, the Management Committee shall appoint sufficient temporary members to make the number up to three, such members serving only for the particular matter for which they are appointed.
- 17.6. The Disciplinary Committee shall deal with any allegation under Rule 17.7 of breach of Rule or Regulation of the Association.
- 17.7. Any allegation referred to in Rule 17.6 must be made in writing to the General Secretary specifying the Rule or Regulation alleged to have been broken, the name of the member or organisation alleged to be in breach and the date and place of the alleged breach.
- 17.8. The Disciplinary Committee shall follow the procedure laid down by the National Council of the ETTA as included in Appendix 'E' to the Rules of the ETTA.
- 17.9. If a formal allegation is proved to its satisfaction the Disciplinary Committee shall have power to impose on the member of organisation guilty of such breach (the offender) one or more of the following penalties:
 - 17.9.1. that he be suspended from the privileges of membership of the Association either indefinitely or for a stated period
 - 17.9.2. that he be fined
 - 17.9.3. that he be censured
 - 17.9.4. The Chairman of the Disciplinary Committee shall, within seven days of the hearing, notify its decision in writing to the General Secretary, who shall then forthwith notify the member or organisation in writing of the decision, at the same time sending the member or organisation a copy of Rule 18 (Right of Appeal) if the charge has been proved.

18. RIGHT OF APPEAL

- 18.1. Any Member, affiliated club or Local League aggrieved by a decision or action of this association, or a Committee, Officer or official of this Association (except the proper determination of an Appeal), or by the neglect or refusal to do something which this Association or such Committee, Officer or official of this Association is under a duty to do, may appeal against such decision, action, neglect or refusal to the ETTA Board of Appeal.
- 18.2. Any appeal under Rule 18.1 shall be made in writing to the General Secretary of the ETTA within 21 days after notification of the decision or action or the neglect or refusal appealed against, and shall be accompanied by a fee of an amount prescribed by the ETTA. The fee will be returned if the adjudicating body considers the making of an appeal to have been justified (what-ever the result)

19. MATTERS NOT COVERED BY RULES

If any question or matter arises which is not provided for in these Rules, it shall be dealt with by the Management Committee.

20. ALTERATION OF RULES

- 20.1. These Rules may be changed (whether by addition, alteration or deletion) only by decision of an AGM or of a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose.

- 20.2.** Proposals for such changes to be considered by the next AGM shall be submitted in writing to reach the General Secretary not later than the preceding 15th May.
- 20.3.** All proposals so received shall be circulated to all Local Leagues, Directly Affiliated Clubs and Directly Affiliated Individuals affiliated to the Association by not less than 21 days before the date of the next AGM.
- 20.4.** Amendments or Alternative Propositions dealing with the same subject matter shall be accepted for consideration by the AGM if submitted in writing and received by the General Secretary not later than 14 days before the date of the next AGM. Such amendments or alternative proposals shall be circulated to all local leagues, directly affiliated clubs and directly affiliated individuals not less than 7 days before the date of the Annual General Meeting.
- 20.5.** Proposals for such changes to be considered by a Special General Meeting shall be submitted to the General Secretary in writing together with the requisition for the Special General Meeting.
- 20.6.** 20.6 Before any resolution altering these Rules shall be declared carried at least two thirds of the total votes cast must be in favour of that resolution.
- 20.7.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Rule 20.1, the following Rules 2.1,2.2.1,2.2.2,3,4,4.1.5,4.2,5.1.2,5.2,6.1,6.5, 8.4, 9.10 and 9.10(1), 12.2,13,14,15,16,17.6,17.7,18,20.1,20.7, 20.8, may not be changed without the previous written consent of the National Council and may be changed by the National Council without any such change requiring to be approved by a County General Meeting; such a change shall take effect on a date to be specified by the National Council being a date not earlier than one month after the County Association has been given notice of the change.
- 20.8.** The Rules of this Association are subject to the approval of the ETTA.

21. PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENTS

- 21.1.** 21 .1. A President and Vice Presidents shall be elected annually by the AGM. Nominations for President and Vice-Presidents shall be submitted only by the Committee.
- 21.2.** 21.2. The Association may elect a Life Vice-President but only former officers of the Association shall be eligible. The distinction shall be conferred only at an Annual General Meeting and only on the nomination of the Committee.
- 21.3.** 22. HONORARY LIFE MEMBERS
- 21.4.** 22.1. The distinction of Honorary Life Members may be conferred for special or long service with table tennis in Middlesex.
- 21.5.** 22.2. The distinction shall be conferred only at a General Meeting of the Association and candidates shall be nominated only by the Committee.

22. HANDBOOK

- 22.1.** Each Club (whether directly or through a Local League) and Directly Affiliated individuals shall be entitled to receive a free copy of the Association's Handbook.

23. EMERGENCY POWERS

In case of emergency the powers of the management Committee may be exercised by (any of) the Chairman, Deputy Chairman, General Secretary, provided that any such exercise shall be confirmed by the next Management Committee Meeting.

Note:

The "County of Middlesex" as defined by the Rules of the ETTA consists of the London Boroughs of Barnet, Brent, Camden, Ealing, Enfield, Hackney, Hammersmith, Haringey, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Islington, Kensington and Chelsea, Tower Hamlets and Westminster and the City of London.

MIDDLESEX INTER-LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIPS REGULATIONS

1. (a) The competitions shall be known as the Middlesex Inter-League Championships
(b) No additions to, or alterations or rescission of the Regulations shall be effected unless at the Annual General Meeting or at a Special General Meeting convened for the purpose. Any proposed addition or rescission of the Regulations shall be submitted to the Hon. General Secretary not later than 15th May, or together with the demand for a Special General Meeting.
(c) No Resolution submitted under 1(b) shall be declared carried unless at least three-fifths of the total votes cast are in favour of the resolution.
Proxies will be recognised only if they have been given in writing and refer to a specific decision on a specific resolution. Voting: Each local league shall be entitled to one vote for each
(d) team which fulfilled its fixtures in the Championships in the immediately preceding season. No directly affiliated club or directly affiliated individual is entitled to vote.
2. There shall be four competitions: (a) The Victor Barna Competition: (b) The Norman Pegg Competition: (c) The Russell Grant Middlesex Competition: (d) The Ted Connell Competition.
(e) The winning team in each competition shall be entitled to hold the trophy for that competition for one season.
3. (a) In all competitions there shall be a First Division and as many other Divisions (Second, Third, etc.) as are necessary.
(b) (i) A player participating in the Russell Grant Middlesex Competition must be under 18 years of age on 31st December during the current Administrative Year.

- (ii) a player participating in the Ted Connell Competition must be over 40 years of age on 1st January during the current Administrative Year.
4. Leagues may enter as many teams as they wish, but not more than two in the First Division.
 5. (a) In all competitions, at the end of each season relegation and promotion shall be on the basis of the lowest team in the First Division being relegated to the Second Division, and the top team in the Second Division being promoted to the First Division, subject to 4 above. Promotion to, and relegation from, the Second Division, and etc., shall be governed in a like manner.
(b) If two Leagues are level in points, their respective sets average shall determine the position; if level on sets then games average shall be the deciding factor; if level on games, then points average shall be used to determine the position.
 6. Victor Barna Competition.
(a) A team shall consist of three men, and a match shall consist of nine sets.
(b) A, B, C shall be the home men; X, Y, Z the away men, the order of play being AvX, BvY, CvZ, BvX, AvZ, CvY, BvZ, CvX, AvY'
(c) Three points shall be awarded to the winning team where the result is 9 - 0, 8 - 1, 7 - 2, or 6 - 3, but if the result is 5 - 4 the winning team shall be awarded two points and the losing team one point.
 7. Norman Pegg Competition
(a) A team shall consist of at least two women, and a match shall consist of five sets.
(b) A and B shall be the home women, and X and Y the away women, the order of play being A v X, B v Y, Doubles, A v Y, B v X.
(c) Three points shall be awarded to the winning team where the result is 5 - 0 or 4 - 1, but if the result is 3 - 2, the winning team shall be awarded two points and the losing team one point.
 8. Russell Grant Middlesex Competition
(a) A team shall consist of three boys, who must play in order of merit and one girl, and a match shall consist of nine sets.
(b) A, B, C, shall be the home boys in order of merit and X, Y, Z the away boys in order of merit, the order of play being B v X, C v Z, A v Y, Mixed Doubles, Boys' Doubles, Girls' Singles, B v Z, A v X, C v Y.
(c) No boy shall play in more than three sets.
(d) Three points shall be awarded to the winning team where the result is 9 - 0, 8 - 1, 7 - 2, or 6 - 3, but if the result is 5 - 4 the winning team shall be awarded two points and the losing team one point.
 9. Ted Connell Competition
(a) A team shall consist of three men, who must play in order of merit, and one woman, and a match shall consist of nine sets.
(b) A, B, C shall be the home men in order of merit and X, Y, Z the away men in order of merit, the order of play being B v X, C v Z, A v Y Mixed Doubles, Men's Doubles, Women's Singles, B v Z, A v X, C v Y.
(c) No man shall play in more than three sets.

- (d) Three points shall be awarded to the winning team where the result is 9 - 0, 8 - 1, 7 - 2, or 6 - 3, but if the result is 5 - 4 the winning team shall be awarded two points and the losing team one point.
10. Victor Barna, Norman Pegg, Russell Grant Middlesex and Ted Connell Competitions.
- (a) Each set shall be the best of three games.
- (b) Any player not available to play when his set is called shall forfeit that particular set; 15 minutes shall be allotted to each set, except where the order of play is altered by agreement of the captains before the commencement of play.
- (c) A league not fielding a full team in a match will be liable to a fine of £5 per player short.
- (d) A team conceding a match shall be liable to a fine of £10.
11. (i) It shall be decided by Resolution at each Annual General Meeting which of Sections A or B below shall be adopted for each of the four competitions for the forthcoming season. If a Resolution is not passed adopting Section A or B then the competition in question will not be held that season.
- (ii) Regulation 11A
- (a) At least 14 days before the commencement of the period scheduled for a match, the home league match secretary shall submit to the away league match secretary two week-day evenings and may in addition offer one week-end date, and the away league shall accept one of these dates at least 7 days before the commencement of the said period. The home league shall notify the Hon. Championships Secretary of the agreed date at least 3 days before the commencement of the said period. No date shall be offered to clash with a Middlesex County match or the Middlesex Open, Middlesex Closed, English Open or English (National) Closed Championships. Should it prove impossible to agree a date in a scheduled period for a match, the match may be postponed subject to the following: Not later than the last day of the scheduled period, both league match secretaries shall notify the Hon. Championships Secretary of the date agreed for the match. The match shall then be played on this date and should either league subsequently be unable to play on this date the match shall automatically be awarded to the other league.
- (b) A match not played during its scheduled period for which the Hon. Championships Secretary has not been advised of the agreed date in accordance with the above, or has not received a claim for points by default, shall be declared void.
- (c) All matches must start not later than 7.30 p.m.
- It is the responsibility of the Home League to ensure that the completed match result sheet be sent to the Hon. Championships Secretary within 48 hours of the match being played.
- (d) The Home League shall retain the whole of any proceeds from a match.
- (e) In any Competition, the Leagues concerned may, by mutual agreement, play off their fixtures over two or three week-ends at a mutually agreed venue and sharing all expenses equally. The Hon. Championships Secretary must be advised of the arrangements.
- (iii) Regulation 11 B

- (a) The Association shall arrange a weekend or weekends in which all matches in a competition shall be played, and a venue or venues for that competition.
 - (b) All expenses in hiring venue(s) shall be shared equally by the teams entered.
 - (c) The Russell Grant Middlesex and the Ted Connell competitions may be played on the same date.
The Victor Barna and Norman Pegg competitions may be played on the same date.
 - (d) Not less than 8 weeks before the first date chosen, the Association will inform all Leagues of the dates and venue(s) chosen and shall issue entry forms.
 - (e) The closing date for entry and for receipt of entry forms shall be 4 weeks before the first date chosen.
 - (f) Should it be necessary to restrict entry no League's 2nd team shall have precedence over any League's 1st team or 3rd team over a 2nd team and so on.
12. Leagues shall register with the Hon. Championships Secretary the players for each competition one month before the commencement of that competition, indicating the order of merit. Additional players can be registered in order of merit at any time but may not play in a match within 7 days of registration. The order of merit can be altered on the 1st of each month. No player may play for more than one league in anyone season or for different Leagues in successive seasons, unless the last League represented ceases to enter the Inter-League Competitions or the Hon. General Secretary of that league has given his permission in writing to the Hon. Championships Secretary. All players must be duly registered members. Registered players shall be entitled to represent their league if:
- (a) They play in at least 50 per cent of their Club's league matches, to be calculated at the time of playing of each Inter-League match in question. Or
 - (b) They shall have represented the League in a previous season, subject to not having subsequently played for another league. Or
 - (c) They shall be permanently resident in the area controlled by, and available to play for, the Middlesex Table Tennis Association, and shall never have represented any league in the competition in any previous season.
13. A player having played twice for any higher team shall not be eligible to play for any lower team. No player may play below his or her ranked position.
14. Any set won by an unregistered player shall be awarded to the opposing team. If players in a team play out of ranked order, any set won by such player against an opponent he would not otherwise have played shall be awarded to the opposing team.
15. The annual subscription shall be £2.50 per team entered in any of the Competitions.
16. The County Executive Committee shall decide on all disputes concerning the contravention or interpretation of any of the foregoing Regulations, and shall have power to impose fines as they may deem necessary, such fines being sent to the Hon. Treasurer of the Association immediately upon request of the Hon. Championships Secretary. The Committee's ruling on all points shall be final and binding.
